Dear Friends,

Last week, the ladies of the Tuesday Night Bible Study began a new class called “Crafted and Called”. It helps us be aware of our talents and gifts so that we can better understand our call. And it reminds us that yes, each of us is called. Over the past months, I have learned many things about God’s call. First, it requires that we quiet our lives and our minds enough to hear. Defining and understanding our talents also helps us see the path more clearly.

But, truthfully, what stands out most for me is just how scary God’s call can be. It can lead us down a path we never imagined, doing things we never thought possible. When Jeff and I first started talking about my call into ministry, it didn’t seem real. I could think of a million things that would stand in the way, a million reasons why I would never actually become a minister. And yet, here I am, preaching this weekend at the Saturday and (for the first time) the Sunday services at my church.

As I come into this weekend, I will tell you one more thing that I have learned. No matter how alien or unsettling the path feels, God walks with us each step of the way. And, we are surrounded by the “cloud of witnesses” we call church family.

I will be able to stand in front of all of you and preach only because I know that I am not talking to strangers. I am simply sharing God’s word with my church. I will look out and see your faces and remember the hugs, the prayers, and the words of encouragement.

By the way...when you feel God’s call, that same church family will “have YOUR back”. And I’ll be right there with them, right by your side.
