



Disability Awareness Sunday Sunday, June 10


On Sunday, June 10, adults and children alike, will be able to experience what it feels like to have certain disabilities at our Disability Awareness Fair in Fellowship Hall.


United Methodist Women Book Discussion Group Wednesday, May 16, 10:00 am

Pillowcase Making Workshop May 16, 7:00 pm




