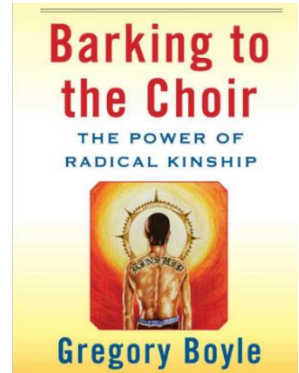

Men's Basketball is Back!

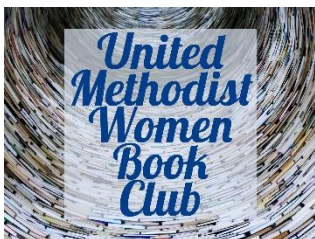
Beginning Tuesday, October 16, 7:00 pm

Rev. Remigijus Matulaitis' appointment as the first Lithuanian-born District Superintendent for the Methodist Church in Lithuania was a major step forward.
