


Refueling Our Faith Using Motors Monday, April 1, 6:00 pm

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

So... why the pink shoes?

Even before our modern culture of overwork, the church built in some time in its calendar to take a break. Right in the middle of the season we call Lent, the six weeks of quiet and reflection, there's one week that doesn't look like the others. Rose Sunday, or Laetare Sunday [Latin for *rejoice*], is a little break from the more reserved and somber tone of the season.
