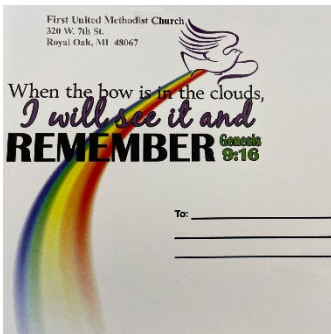
JOIN OUR CHOIR CAMP STAFF!

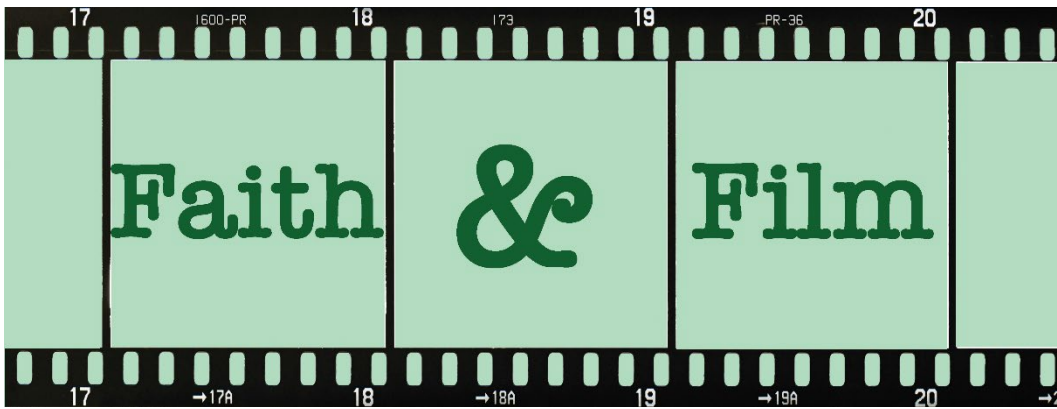
