


2nd FAITH & FILM MOVIE IS TOMORROW!


ABIDE MEN'S MINISTRY

SAVE THE DATE FOR ROYAL OAK FIRST'S VISIONING DAY



LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This past week, many of us saw "The Color Purple" together. It is a powerful film. It really got me thinking about the title of the film, and the book it is based on.

Why purple?

Here is an interesting thing about purple: as a color on the light spectrum, it can't exist on its own. It appears at the edges of red, orange, yellow, green, blue and violet. It is at the point where these colors are most fully saturated in themselves that purple is seen. Where these colors are most honest and authentic and clear, a purple line appears stretching the entire length of the light spectrum. Purple is the light of relationship that touches all other colors of light at that moment when they are being most fully themselves.

Blue and red sit at the extremes, swirling at the outer-edges of what can be seen, but when they are brought together there is purple.

Purple unites the edges into an integrated whole.

It is what happened in the film and we know that when the Spirit of Jesus is alive within us and within our community, we find a home that the exclusivity of the world too often cannot offer us.

If you come to worship this Sunday, I invite you to wear something purple and we will lean into the unifying spirit that shows up when we sing, pray and share life together.

Join us this Monday for the film "Wonka". We will gather at the MJR in Troy at 7:00 p.m. Adult tickets are \$8.50 and kids tickets are free for this movie.
