LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

If you are following the news this week, you may have learned of some significant changes that happened for the United Methodist Church as a denomination. This week around 1000 elected delegates from across the globe gathered in North Carolina for worship, prayer and discernment about the future direction of the United Methodist Church. As has been the case for the last several General Conferences, the issue of inclusion for LGBTQ+ Christians was a central topic of conversation.

This Conference marked a significant change for a fuller inclusion of our LGBTQ+ friends, neighbors and fellow Methodists. The language describing same-gender relationships as "incompatible with Christian teaching" has been removed along with the disqualifying of ministerial candidates on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity. In addition, there will no longer be any penalties for clergy performing marriages for same-gender loving couples. These are significant changes to how the United Methodist Church will move into its future.

I believe that these changes were necessary, just and in line with the heart of Jesus as revealed to me in the Gospels. Over my 20 years of active ministry, LGBTQ+ Christians have been leaders in every church I have served. They have been colleagues in ministry and partners in sharing the Gospel of Christ. The pain and hurt caused by years of exclusionary language and practices have been real and often devastating. I pray that this moment in our church's history opens a door for a wider inclusion of ALL God's people to participate in the life of the church, and now makes more space to lean into the other important social justice work to which our faith calls. For Royal Oak First, this allows us to continue our ministry of inclusion and service to the community that has marked this church's nearly 200 year history.

I invite you to visit UMC.org to read the details from this important General Conference. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to any of our pastors and we would be glad to talk with you about this moment and what it means for our shared faith.

This Sunday we will come together at the Communion Table. This is our opportunity to practice the inclusive community of love, acceptance and blessing that I believe is at the very heart of the God made known to us in Jesus.
