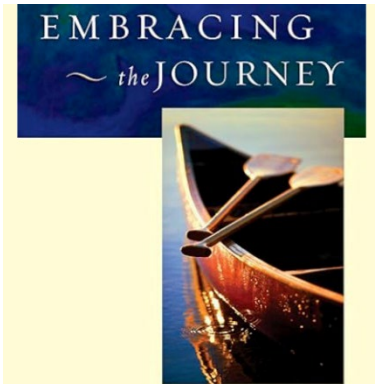

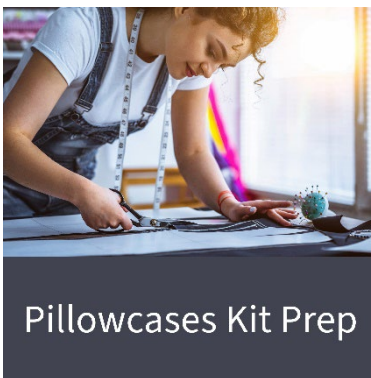


FAITH & BLUE
