LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I felt compelled to reach out to you this week, not just to express my gratitude but to share a bit of my heart during this difficult time. Your support—through prayers, cards, texts, and emails—has been a steady source of comfort as my father completed his earthly journey and entered his eternal rest this past week. I've had the privilege of walking alongside many of you in your own moments of sorrow, yet when it was my turn, I found myself feeling unprepared. Your wisdom, grace, and kindness have lifted Bridget, Sam, Casey, and myself, reminding us that we are not alone. Thank you from the depths of our hearts.

The relationship I shared with my dad can truly be captured by the word "reconciliation." Like many fathers and sons, we faced our share of struggles in understanding and connecting with each other. But by the grace of God, over the past 15 years, we found a path to forgiveness and acceptance—ultimately becoming the best of friends. That bond is a gift I cherish the most.

This week, we will travel to Rhinelander, Wisconsin, to gather with family and friends to celebrate my dad's life. The memorial will be held in the church that has been a cornerstone of our family's faith for over 50 years. It's where my brother was baptized, where we learned and grew together during Sunday School and Vacation Bible School, and where we said goodbye to our mother 26 years ago. My hope is that Royal Oak First will serve as a similar anchor and source of light for each of you.

I look forward to being with you this Sunday. Your love and support will undoubtedly help carry us through this journey.
