

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

One of the greatest honors of my life is helping people celebrate the lives of their loved ones. Over the years, I have been privileged to be present at hundreds of funerals and memorial services.

From these experiences, I've learned two important truths:

- 1. Everyone has a unique story to be told, filled with both struggle and triumph.
- 2. In the retelling of these stories, God's love always shines. Always.

This Sunday, we will celebrate All Saints Day, a time to remember our family and friends who have entered into God's eternal embrace. I trust that both of these truths will be evident as God's light and love shines through those we will remember.

During the service, we will name the 16 members of our community who have entered their eternal rest this past year. We will also provide an opportunity for each of us to remember all of our other friends and family whose memories we carry in our hearts. All Saints' Sunday is our chance to remember and share the stories of those we cherish.

This year's celebration is particularly personal for me, as I have faced two significant losses this past year. This summer, my best high school friend, George, was tragically killed in a car accident. He was my longest-standing friend, and we shared countless laughs and encouragement over the years. This fall, my father passed away after a year of health struggles. I am grateful for our relationship, and I deeply miss our Sunday afternoon phone calls. It is hard to imagine my life without both of them. I am thankful that All Saints Day gives me one more chance to honor, remember, and give thanks for them. I pray that God's light will shine in the candles I will light for them both.

I invite you to join us this Sunday. Bring the names and memories of those you love and who have loved you.
