
SNACKS NEEDED FOR THE COFFEE BAR

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

The church follows a unique calendar, highlighting liturgical seasons that guide us through the life of Christ. Next week marks the first Sunday of Advent, ushering in a new beginning and a new year for the church.

This Sunday, however, is the last Sunday of the church year, known as Christ the King or The Reign of Christ Sunday. It's a moment for us to pause and reflect on how our lives and our church align with the way of Jesus. Endings provide a wonderful opportunity for reflection, allowing us to acknowledge our gratitudes and take stock of our losses. As we transition into this new season, I encourage you to take time this weekend to reflect on the past year.

Examen Practice: Reflecting Christ the King in Our Lives

This Sunday, as we honor Christ the King, let's reflect on how we embody His teachings and identify areas for growth.

Examen Steps

1. Pause and Breathe:

Take a few deep breaths and invite the Holy Spirit to guide your reflections.

2. Gratitude Reflection:

Recall moments from this last year that reflected Christ's love.

Prompt: Write down three instances that brought you joy and connection.

3. Self-Examination:

Identify areas where you struggled to reflect Jesus' teachings.

Prompt: Note one situation this past year where your thoughts or actions didn't align with His way.

4. Openness to Change:

Consider how you can invite Christ's teachings into these areas.

Prompt: Write down one specific step you can take this week to embody His love more fully.

5. Closing Prayer:

Conclude with a prayer for guidance as you seek to follow Jesus.

Prompt: Write a short prayer asking for strength to grow in love and compassion.

May this examen deepen your commitment to reflecting the love of Christ the King in all that you do.
