


most volunteers will be standing, but some sitting tasks are available too. Please scan the QR code to sign up.


LENT SMALL GROUPS BOOK STUDY



LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Beloved Community,

I wanted to take a moment to express my heartfelt gratitude for your generous support which has given our mission a robust financial start to 2025. Your faithful contributions are vital in helping us fulfill our vision of Making Christ's Love Real.

Let me share three impactful ways your gifts are touching lives in our community:

Share the Love: Last month, we delivered 68 care packages to members of our community who may not be able to join us for worship as often as they would like. These tangible acts of love serve as a reminder that God remembers them and is walking alongside them on their journey.

Holy COW: Our Wednesday night fellowship, Holy COW (Church on Wednesdays), is a wonderful mid-week gathering for children and families. Each week, upwards of 50 children, fifth grade and under, come together for a meal, music, prayer, and community. If you ever want to witness the love of Christ in action, stop by Holy COW. It's a beautiful expression of how we are making Christ's love real to our kids and their families.

Essentials Pantry: Through our Outreach on 7th program, we provide a non-food essentials pantry that offers personal hygiene and household cleaning supplies to support underserved populations. We typically give away around 200 rolls of toilet paper each month, and last month, we served a record 82 households—all thanks to your generosity.

A quick reminder about our church finances: we have an annual budget of \$905,033, with 95% funded by contributions from members and those who consider Royal Oak First their church home. This means we need \$75,500 each month to stay on track.

In January, we contributed \$80,141.93 to support the mission and ministries of Royal Oak First. Thank you for your incredible support! I encourage you to stay engaged with our congregation's health and vitality. One way to do this is through regular contributions via direct withdrawal or credit card.
